1. ABOUT THE COLLEGE:

A. Brief History of the college

The college was founded in 1925, two years after the establishment of Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University. Sir Vivian Bose was the founding father of this institution. That time classes were held in Convocation Hall of Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University. In 1940 the college shifted to its present premises. Needless to mention that it was then two years course. The year 1967 saw commencement of full-fledged Three Years Degree Course. From 1984, College has introduced professional legal course i. e. Five Years Law Course.

□ **Vision of the college:**

To develop as a model law college for importing high quality education.

□ **Mission of the college:**

1. To impart professional, legal, liberal and moral education in a just environment of equality and fraternity.
2. To produce intellectually enlightened, spiritually inspired, committed youth to serve as agents of social transformation.
3. To help develop respect for law and its institutions in the society.
4. To spread legal awareness in the society, specially awareness about alternate dispute resolution mechanisms as useful and trustworthy methods of dispute settlement.

□ **Objectives of the college:**

- 3) To develop all round personality of the learners.
- 4) To inculcate moral, social and professional values in the learners.

This institution today is recognised as premier institution of the Central India because it has always striven to produce men and women of very high order.

B. Library Facility

The college provides library facility to its students with more than 15,000 Text and Reference Books and 3,500 periodicals for ready reference. The students are expected to take advantage of the library named after a legend Sir M. B. Dadabhoy.

C. Legal Aid Clinic

The Legal Aid clinic of the college is established under the Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987 and works under the guidance of the District legal service Authority , Nagpur.

D. Games and Sports

The sports department is well equipped and maintained under the guidance of a qualified teacher. Students are encouraged to participate in more than one activities.

Under Ordinance No. 2 of 1996, maximum 10 (Ten) credit marks can be granted to a student appearing in Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University's any degree examination of any Degree, as an incentive for his/ her, participation in any one of the following programmes conducted by the College Viz. NSS, ACE and ES, NCC and CULTURAL ACTIVITIES. According to University Ordinance (1 of 2010) minimum 10 (Ten) and maximum 25 (Twenty Five) marks can be granted for Games & Sports.

E. National Service Scheme

The college has a regular unit of 100 N.S.S. Students. Under this scheme students take part in various activities and render voluntary services to the society. Every year N.S.S. Students of the College represent the college at University level camps. The N.S.S. volunteers of the College have represented the College at National and International level and bagged award from Maharashtra Government.

F. Hostels

The University maintains its Hostel for students. Admission to the Hostel is subject to the prior admission to any College maintained by the University. Application form etc. for admission to the Hostel may be obtained from the Warden of the following University Hostels;

1. University Men's Hostel, Amravati Road, Nagpur.
2. University Women's Hostel, North Ambazari Road, Nagpur.

G. Scholarship to the B. C. Students

Government Scholarships to the eligible students will be available as per the governing rules and schemes, issued from time to time.

H. Students' Aid Fund Scheme

Needy students may get financial assistance under the University's Students' Aid Fund Scheme.

I. Dress Code

Following is the dress code for all the students of the college as below.

1. For Boys - Plain Black Full Pant & Plain White Full Shirt / Half Shirt.
2. For Girls - Plain Black Salwar & Plain White Kurta with Black Dupatta or Black Saree & White Blouse (plain). or Plain Black Full Trouser & Plain White Full shirt/ Half shirt

(Skirts, Jeans, Tops, T-Shirts, Shorts etc. not allowed.)

Note :

- **A student of the college entering the college premises other wise than in the prescribed dress and or without possessing valid Identity Card shall be liable to pay fine as may be prescribed by the college.**
- **A student shall be liable to pay a Fee of Rs. 100/- (One Hundred rupees only) for getting duplicate Identity Card.**

J. General

- (i) Apart from the rules laid down in the Direction governing the undergraduate courses in law, the Directions, Ordinances and Statutes of the University governing admissions, examinations, revaluation, reassessment, attendance and general discipline of the students shall be binding on all the students taking admission in the college. The students shall also be bound by the rules and regulations prescribed by the college from time to time.
- (ii) On admission to the College, a student becomes liable to pay all statutory fees. If, for any reason, a student leaves the College after admission, he will not be refunded any fees.
- (iii) Students residing in Nagpur have to pay their fees as per the prevailing procedure.
- (iv) Every applicant for admission other than the one from Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University, shall submit a Migration Certificate signed by the Registrar of the University or Board from which he migrates, before the expiry of the-first term and pay an Immigration Fee of Rs. 500/- failing which the admission shall stand cancelled.
- (v) Persons not already enrolled as students of Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University shall pay the prescribed University Enrolment Fee at the time of admission in the College.

- (vi) A student admitted to the College shall be required to pursue a regular course of study which means **attendance of atleast 75% of lectures actually delivered in the subject, including tutorials, moot court, practical training and skilled based courses. If a student fails to do so he/she shall be liable to be detained from appearing for internal as well as University examinations. A student must monitor his/her attendance. No separate notice will be issued by the college in this regard.** However, Principal of the college may in his discretion, for exceptional reasons including medical reason, allow a student to take examinations of the college and the University if the student concerned has attended at least 65% of the classes. Further the Vice-Chancellor of the University in his discretion, may allow student to take the college & University examinations if the student has attended at-least 60% of the classes conducted by the college in the subject / subjects. The condonation of absence on medical ground, in any semester, shall not exceed 10 days. In order to avail this condonation Student must submit the medical certificate from a medical practitioner or the hospital promptly and not after the detention list is displayed by the college. The Vice-Chancellor may delegate his power of condonation of absence to the Principal either generally or on case by case basis.

Explanation :

- (1) The requirement of 75% attendance is applicable to the individual subjects prescribed for the semester in question.
 - (2) Except for the 1st Semester counting of attendance shall begin from the date of re-opening of the college and classes and not from the actual date of admission of the student.
 - (3) No concession in attendance will be granted on the ground of employment (Public or private) or on the ground of pursuing any other professional or non-professional course simultaneously.
- (vii) Students who are awarded Scholarships or Free Studentships by the University or State Government must attend all periods without fail. If they are unable to attend them, on any day, they must send an application for leave countersigned by their local guardian and obtain permission. Failure in this respect may invite for forfeiture of the Scholarship, Freeship in whole or in part.
- (viii) Students are required to keep the office of the College informed of their address in Nagpur and also of their permanent address, if Nagpur is not their permanent home. Change of address must be duly communicated to the office which will not be responsible for the non-delivery of a communication through any mistake in the address as recorded in its registers.
- (ix) Other information regarding Examinations may be obtained from the University Calendar or its website.
- (x) 3% seats are reserved for Physically handicapped students and 1% seat are reserved for present and Ex-servicemen and Military Personnel or their wards.

- (xi) The medium of instruction shall be English.
- (xii) The syllabus of the course can be obtained from the Publication Department, University Library, Nagpur. (Available also on website of the University)
- (xiii) Students who have passed the qualifying examination from other Boards Universities should submit an Eligibility Certificate obtainable from the University at the time of admission.
- (xiv) Under the Maharashtra Prohibition of Ragging Act, 1999, ragging in any form, as defined in Sec. 2 (C) thereof, is prohibited. Any student found indulging in such act shall be liable for punishment of imprisonment upto 2 years and a fine of Rs. 10,000/-. Further, such student shall be rusticated from the College and debarred for five years from seeking admission in any other College/Institution.
- (xv) A notice to a student displayed on the notice board shall be deemed to be an adequate notice wherever notice to an individual student is required to be served for any purpose.
- (xvi) The property of the college is the common property for natural and reasonable use by the students. It is, therefore, collective responsibility of the students to protect and preserve the property of the college. Therefore, every student, unless there is evidence to the contrary, shall be jointly and severally liable to compensate the college for any loss or damage to any property of the college. In this regard decision of the disciplinary committee constituted by the Principal shall be final and binding.

L. Concession in Tuition Fees and Examinations Fees to Backward Class Students for the Year

With a view to providing educational facilities amongst the Backward Classes, it has been the policy of the Government to provide free education irrespective of age and Income at all stages of education and in all types of recognised Institution. The students belonging to backward classes shall be eligible for concession in the tuition and examination fee as per the schemes of the governments adopted by the University.

3. TIMING OF THE CLASSES :

Classes for LL. B. (Three Years Course) as well as for the Final year of the B. A. LL. B. (Five Years Course) shall be held in the *MORNING* and all other Classes shall be held in the *AFTERNOON* as per the time table framed and displayed by the college.

4. PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSION :

- (a) Admission to entry level semester will be given to the candidates who have passed the MH-CET (Law) conducted by the Maharashtra State. Admission will be on the basis of comparative merit in CET score. In case of tie the marks in the qualifying examination shall be taken into account.
- (b) Application form for admission together with a copy of the Prospectus for the Law courses will be made available in the office of Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University's Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar College of Law, Amravati Road on payment of Rs. 50/- in cash.
- (c) Application form for admission shall be submitted in the office of the college, during office hours on or before the last date notified separately, accompanied by a non-refundable Registration fee of Rs. 25/- in cash payable to the Principal along with true copies of the Mark sheet, CET score, and the College Leaving Certificate signed by the Principal or Head Master of the Institution last attended. Candidates belonging to Backward Community are required to enclose true copy of their Caste Certificate. Candidates belonging to OBC should submit true copy of Non-Creamy Layer Certificate also.
- (d) One photograph of the applicant duly attested by a Gazetted Officer/Principal of an affiliated College/ A Member of the Senate of Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University should be affixed on the Application Form.
- (e) Employer's permission to join the course should be obtained by the students who are in public or private employment.
- (f) Admission to higher level semesters will be given on merit basis if vacancies are available.

- (a) Admission to the programme shall be made by the respective college admission committee in accordance with the rules and instructions provided from time to time by Bar Council of India and the admission policy of the State Government. The reservation policy of the Government of Maharashtra governing admission to higher educational institutions, issued from time to time, shall also be followed.
- (b) An applicant who has successfully completed 10+2 or Intermediate or equivalent from a recognized University of India or outside or from a Senior Secondary Board or equivalent, constituted or recognized by the Union or by a State Government or from any equivalent institution from a foreign country recognized by the government of that country for the purpose of issue of qualifying certificate on successful completion of the course, may apply for and be admitted into the B.A., LL.B. 5 Years Degree Course, If the candidate has been declared eligible as per the MH-CET (Law) examination.
- (c) **Rules regarding provisional admission : A student can take provisional admission in the higher class if he has applied for reassessment and expects to become eligible for admission on favorable result of assessment. - (a) Admission to the programme shall be made by the respective college admission committee and in accordance with the rules and instructions provided from time to time in this regard by the Bar Council of India. The reservation policy and rules of the Government of Maharashtra governing admission to higher educational institutions issued from time to time shall also be followed. An applicant who has **graduated in any discipline** of knowledge from a University established by an Act of Parliament or by a state legislature or from an equivalent national institution recognized as a deemed to be University or from a foreign University recognized as equivalent to the status of an Indian University by an authority competent to declare equivalence, and has qualified in the MH-CET (Law) conducted by the State of Maharashtra, may apply for LL. B. (Three Years) law degree programme. Admission will be given on basis of comparative merit in CET score. In case of tie the marks in the qualifying examination shall be taken into account.
- (b) **Rules regarding provisional admission : A student can take provisional admission in the higher class if he has applied for reassessment and expects to become eligible for admission on favorable result of assessment. B) MEANING OF IMPORTANT TERMS :

FOR B.A.LL.B 5 YEARS COURSE :

Advanced Diploma in Law : For the purposes of this Direction, Advanced Diploma in Law shall mean a Diploma awarded in accordance with para 13 of this Direction.

Certificate : For the purposes of this Direction, Certificate shall mean Certificate in Arts (Law) issued in accordance with para 13 of this Direction.

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) : The CBCS means a system in which choice is provided for students to select from the prescribed courses wherever options are provided in the course. Papers prescribed for this program in Appendix-I of this Direction.

Course : It is equivalent to a paper/subject in a semester. It is a complete unit of learning which will be taught and evaluated within a Semester.

Credit : Credit means the unit by which the course work is measured. It is measured in terms of weekly Clock hours assigned to a Course i.e., one credit is equivalent to 1 clock hours per week.

Credit Point (CP) : It is the value obtained by multiplying the grade Point by the Credit i.e., No. of Credits assigned for the course X Grade Points secured for that course.

Credit Transfer : The credit acquired for the courses in another University/ through SWAYAM (MOOCs Courses) would be accepted on reciprocal basis subject to the UGC & other applicable norms in force from time to time.

Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA):

1. For purposes of Certificate in Arts (Law), CGPA refers to the Cumulative Grade Point Average weighed across the first two semester. It is obtained by dividing total number of credit points in the first two semesters by the total number of credits in the said semesters.
2. For purposes of Diploma in Arts (LAW), CGPA refers to the Cumulative Grade Point Average weighted across the first four semester. It is obtained by dividing total number of credit points in the first four semesters by the total number of credits in the said semesters.
3. For Purposes of B.A> (Law) Degree, CGPA refers to the Cumulative Grade Point Average weighted across the first six semesters. It is obtained by dividing total number of credit points in the first six semesters by the total number of credits in the said semesters.
4. For purposes of Advanced Diploma in Law, CGPA refers to the Cumulative Grade Point Average weighted across all ten semester. It is obtained by dividing total number of credit points in all ten semesters by the total number of credits in the said semesters.

Degree : For the purposes of this Direction, Degree shall mean a Degree awarded in accordance with para 13 of this Direction and includes B.AA. (Law) after successful completion of first three years and B.A.LL.B. after successful completion of all Five years.

Diploma : For purposes of this Direction, Diploma shall mean a diploma in Arts (Law) awarded in accordance with para 13 of this direction

Grade Point : Grade Point is weightage allotted to each grade letter depending on the marks awarded in a course/ paper.

Grade Letter : Grade Letter is an index to indicate the performance of a student in a particular course/ Paper. It is the transformation to actual marks secured by a student in a course/paper. It is indicated by a Grade letter O, A, B, C, D, E, and F. There is a range of marks for each Grade letter.

Grade Letter Average : refers to the Grade Letter awarded after summing up external and internal marks obtained in each course/ paper.

New Credit Based System (NCBS) : The New Credit Based System Shall mean the NCBS as defined under Direction No. 33 of 2019.

Programme : For purposes of this Direction, Programme shall mean, a Five year programme of study and examination spread over TEN semesters, the successful completion of which would lead to the award of B.A.LL.B. degree.

Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) : SGPA indicates the performance of a student in a given Semester. It is obtained by dividing the total credit points in the semester by total number of credits for that semester.

(As per Directions No. 5 of 2023)

FOR LL.B 3 YEARS COURSE :

- (a) **Certificate**: For the purposes of this Direction, Certificate shall mean a Certificate in Law issued in accordance with para 13 of this Direction.
- (b) **Choice Based Credit System (CBCS)**: The CBCS provide choice for students to select from the prescribed courses wherever options are provided in the course/papers prescribed for this program in Appendix-I
- (c) **Course**: It is equivalent to a paper/subject in a semester. It is complete unit of learning which will be taught and evaluated within a Semester.
- (d) **Credit**: Credit means the unit by which the course work is measured. It is measured in terms of weekly Clock hours assigned to a course i.e., one credit is equivalent to 1 clock hour per week.
- (e) **Credit Point (CP)**: It is the value obtained by multiplying the Grade Point by the Credit i.e. No. of Credits assigned for the course x Grade Points secured for that course.
- (f) **Credit Transfer**: The credit acquired for the courses in another University or in SWAYAM (MOOC) courses would be accepted on reciprocal basis subject to the UGC Norms in force from time to time.
- (g) **Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)**:
 - i. For purposes of Certificate in Law, CGPA refers to the Cumulative Grade Point Average weighted across the first two semesters. It is obtained by dividing total number of credit points in the first two semesters by the total number of credits in the said semesters for purposes of Certificate in Law.
 - ii. For purposes of Diploma in Law, CGPA refers to the Cumulative Grade Point Average weighed across the first four semesters. It is obtained by dividing total number of credit points in the first four semesters

- by the total number of credits in the said semesters.
- iii. For purposes of LL.B Degree, CGPA refers to the Cumulative Grade Point Average weighed across all six semesters. It is obtained by dividing total number of credit points in all six semesters by the total number of credits in the said semesters.
- (h) **Degree:** For the purposes of this Direction, Degree shall mean a Degree awarded in accordance with para 13 of this Direction after completion of Three years LL.B programme.
- (i) **Diploma:** For purposes of this Direction, Diploma shall mean a Diploma in Law awarded in accordance with para 13 of this Direction.
- (j) **Grade Letter:** Grade Letter is an index to indicate the performance of a student in a particular course/ Paper. It is the transformation of actual marks secured by student in a course/paper. It is indicated by a Grade letter O, A,B,C,D,E and F. There is a range of marks for each Grade Letter.
- (k) **Grade Point:** Grade Point is weightage allotted to each grade letter depending on the marks awarded in a course/paper.
- (l) **New Credit Based System (NCBS):** New Credit Based System means New Credit System as defined under Direction no 34 of 2019.
- (m) **Programme :** For the purposes of this Direction, Programme means a THREE year Programme of study and examination spread over SIX semesters, the successful completion of which would lead to the award of LL.B 3 year Degree.
- (n) **Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) :** SGPA indicates the performance of a student in a given Semester. SGPA is obtained by dividing the total credit points earned by the student in all the courses/papers by the total number of credits assigned to the courses/papers in a Semester.

C) AWARD OF INTERNAL MARKS :

Distribution of 20 marks for internal assessment, wherever there is a provision for internal assessment shall be as follows :

D) ABOUT INTERNSHIP :

- (i) Each registered student has to complete minimum of 12 weeks internship during the entire period of his/her studies under any NGO, Trial or Appellate Lawyer, Judiciary, Legal Regulatory Authorities, Legislatures and Parliament, Other Legal Functionaries, Market Institutions, Law Firms, Companies and Local Self Government.
- (ii) The internship in any semester cannot be for a continuous period of more than Four Weeks and the internship programme will commence from the semester indicated in the syllabus here under. Each student shall keep internship diary in the form stipulated by the University and the same shall be evaluated by the Guide in Internship and a Core Faculty member of the college in each semester.

E) EVALUATION SYSTEM :

Based on his/her continuous evaluation, the academic performance of a student during a semester shall be graded on a Seven-point scale. The grade awarded to a student shall depend on his/her performance in external and internal examinations.

- (a) The academic performance of a student during a semester and at the end of the programme, shall be evaluated on the basis of :
 - (i) Grade Point (GP) obtained in each subject
 - (ii) Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA)
 - (iii) Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)
- (b) Marks for Extra Curricular Components (E.C.C.) are to be awarded at the end of each even semester in recognition of achievements in sports/cultural/N.S.S./NCC as per the rules and instruction of the University provided in this regard from time to time. The marks shall be used for upgrading CGPA.
- (c) At the end of each semester examination, a student shall be awarded a Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA). A Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) shall be awarded to each student at the end of Final Semester of the Programme. The details regarding method of calculating SGPA & CGPA is explained in detail in para E infra.

- (d) Student who passed Audit Course shall be given 'AU' grade, while students who failed in Audit course will be given 'X' grade. However, these grades and marks in Audit Course shall not be considered for calculation of SGPA & CGPA.
- (e) The result of the successful candidate in the final semester shall be classified as follows :
- i) First Division with Distinction : CGPA from 8.00 and above
 - ii) First Division : CGPA from 6.67 to 7.99
 - iii) Second Division : CGPA from 5.56 to 6.66
 - iv) Pass Division : CGPA from 5.00 to 5.55

F) AWARD OF GRADE LETTER AND GRADE POINT :

- (a) Each course/paper shall be valued in Seven Grades. The letter grades and their equivalent grade points are listed below.

- (b) **Calculation of Credit Points (CP):** Credit Points for the course = No. of Credits assigned for the course X Grade Point secured for that course.
- (c) **Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA):** SGPA indicates the performance of a student in a given Semester. SGPA is based on the total credit points earned by the student in all the courses and the total number of credits assigned to the courses/papers in a Semester. SGPA shall be rounded off to two decimal points. (e.g. - 6.578 rounded to 6.58 & 6.574 will be rounded to 6.57)

$$\text{SGPA} = \frac{\text{Total Credit Points in the Semester}}{\text{Total Number of Credits for the Semester}}$$

Note :- SGPA is computed only if the candidate passes in all the courses (gets a minimum 'E' Grade in all Courses).

- (d) **Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)** : CGPA refers to the Cumulative Grade Point Average weighted across all the semesters. CGPA shall be rounded to two decimal Points (e. g. - 6.578 rounded to 6.58 & 6.574 will be rounded to 6.57)

$$\text{SGPA} = \frac{\text{Total Number of Credits for the Semester}}{\text{Total Credits of all Semesters}}$$

Note:- CGPA is calculated only when the candidate passes in all the courses of all semesters

F) BETTERMENT OF PERFORMANCE :

Students may be allowed to repeat any two of the theory papers/courses in the next due semester for betterment of marks and grade provided the student secures less than 60% marks in that paper. No betterment shall be allowed in the internal assessment and in practical/ clinical papers in any semester. A student who opt for betterment will be disqualified from being considered for award of Medals, Merit, Ranks etc. (For details refer to relevant ordinance)

G) AWARD OF DEGREE :

A student will be eligible for the award of Degree only when he/she has successfully completed all the prescribed courses and has secured the prescribed minimum CGPA for the course under the relevant direction and after payment of prescribed fee.

H) AWARD OF MEDALS AND MERIT CERTIFICATES :

Candidates who appear and pass the examination in all the papers of each and every semester at first appearance only are eligible for the award of Medals/ Prizes/Rank Certificates etc. The marks allotted for Extra Curricular Components shall be taken into account for deciding the interse Merit as well as the award of medals.

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
